

Schmidt Hammer Lassen and Niras to develop holiday park

The billion-kroner project is solely financed by the Monaco-based real estate developer John Bengt Møller. The architect Morten Schmidt told EjendomsWatch that his firm's collaboration with the expat Dane is "excellent".

Behind the large-scale holiday park project - worth an estimated 1 billion kroner - on the island of Møn, which EjendomsWatch previously wrote about in August, is the consulting engineering company Niras and the architect Morten Schmidt from Schmidt Hammer Larsen (SHL).

The project will be financed by expat Dane John Bengt Møller, who develops and invests in real estate projects the world over.

"SHL has been approached about the project in the same way our clients usually contact us," wrote Schmidt in an e-mail response to EjendomsWatch, referring to the collaboration with Møller as "excellent".

"Together with John Bengt Møller, we will build an appealing base for tourists and visitors who want to explore the magnificent nature of Møn and the numerous exciting projects that have come to fruition over the past few years to boost tourism," he added.

The funding for the project stems from the expat Dane's company Great Global Holdings, according to Schmidt. He noted that the project, called Møns Klint Feriepark, has been met with support from the local municipal council.

"Vordingborg Municipality has just given us the green light to go ahead with the project, and considering the broad political backing, we look forward to the zoning plan to be adopted this spring," said Schmidt.

Mayor Mikael Smed stated in a press release that the project can "bring us one giant step closer to our vision of increasing Møn's overnight accommodation capacity and tourism revenue in the municipality."

"It's a really exciting project that's been submitted to Vordingborg Municipality, and if it goes ahead there's no doubt that it will boost tourism and retail trade not just on Møn, but throughout Vordingborg Municipality," said the mayor in the press release.
